Economic and Community Development

October is Rotary Economic and Community Development Month. Economic and community development is one of Rotary's six areas of focus. Unemployment, underemployment, lack of economic opportunity, lack of appropriate training, and the absence of social safety nets lie at the core of poverty. For the poor, labor is often the only asset available to improve well-being.

Creating productive employment opportunities is essential for reducing poverty and achieving sustainable economic and social development, and for providing income security and empowerment especially for women, people with disabilities, youth, and the extremely poor.

Like education and health strategies, generating income and creating opportunities for a productive workforce and entrepreneurship are essential for reducing poverty.

Extreme global poverty has decreased considerably in the past three decades. In 1981, more than half of the people in the developing world lived on less than \$1.25 a day. This rate dropped dramatically to 21% in 2010. But 1.2 billion people still live in extreme poverty. To help end extreme poverty by 2030, Rotarians need to identify the poor and empower them to make meaningful change and promote their own priorities
