A Second Look: Epidemic in Chicago



In 1956, Moreno had just started college and was working with other teenagers on the northwest side of Chicago in the Northwest Youth Council, an organization that aimed to keep kids off the streets. To raise money, the council sold produce from a storefront and from a truck that served the surrounding neighborhood.

That year, Chicago faced a major polio epidemic. The city closed all the public and private swimming pools, then the beaches, then the day camps, and all the other public places where children congregated. People stayed home. Our storefront produce sales plummeted, but we still had the neighborhood delivery route. But, as the epidemic continued, the city banned all outdoor sales of food products: hot dog stands, street sweets vendors, and neighborhood produce wagons. We were out of business.

The health department put an emergency mass immunization program into operation. By the first week in August the epidemic was halted. Of the more than 1,000 cases of polio reported in September, not one case was from an individual who had received the vaccine. Events began to get back to normal. The pools and beaches opened. The Northwest Youth Council decided to make money through bingo. City schools opened in the fall.

But then I learned that a friend and classmate, Robert Urbaszewski, a leader in glee club and his church choir and a coworker in many campus organizations, had contracted polio. Robert was not going to be in class, he was going to be in an iron lung. Robert, who was an excellent dancer, was not going to be part of our exhibition square dance troupe. Robert was not going to graduate with us.
