# ShelterBox Response to Turkey/Syria



The ShelterBox assessment team has relocated to Gaziantep in Southern Turkey where pre-existing humanitarian hubs were based and the epicenter of the earthquake. The search and rescue phase is ending and efforts will largely turn to recovery. ShelterBox is gathering emergency shelter aid and essential household items. We anticipate distributing tents and shelter kits, stoves, thermal blankets, and clothing to keep people warm through the freezing winter nights.

We are also considering cash vouchers to help people buy what they need to survive. Our solar lights will help people when there is no electricity and help charge phones to keep them in contact. Our tents will help people to shelter from the winter weather, prevent the spread of disease, and provide some privacy. We're also providing thousands of blankets and expect items like mattresses to be needed. Warm children's clothing is being distributed in northern Syria. Our supply chain team at ShelterBox is working around the clock to get supplies from prepositioning hubs across the world to Turkey and Syria. Your help is needed.
