## ATTRACTING BIRDS TO YOUR YARD CAN BE A JOY

It's simple to set up a BIRD BATH! Put a container of water about 2.5 feet above ground. If you don't have a base to set your birdbath on, buy a small bath that has clamps making it easy



to attach it to a surface such as your deck. Keep the water no deeper than two to three inches. I put a flat rock in its center to give the birds "footing." Regularly rinse the bath with fresh water, rinse and refill with fresh water. Keep a brush on hand to periodically clean it.

WINTER: "The simplest way to provide water in winter is to set out a plastic bowl at the same time each day, and bring it in when ice forms." Another of several possibilities is: When the water freezes, pour hot water into it (unless it's glass) in the morning, enough that some water melts in the container.



## Youth Service Month

May is Youth Service Month. Rotary believes in developing the next generation of leaders. Our programs help younger leaders build leadership skills, expand education and learn the value of service. Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills and learn about the world through service projects and activities.

RYLA is a leadership development program for young people who want to learn new skills, build their confidence, and have fun. Events range from one-day seminars to weeklong camps. Rotary Youth Exchange builds peace one young person at a time. Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens.

Exchanges for students ages 15-19 are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries. New Generations Service Exchange is a short-term, customizable program for university students and professionals up to age 30. Participants can design exchanges that combine their professional goals with a humanitarian project. Let's celebrate our young people!



The **Outstanding Career and Technical Education Award** is a \$1,000 scholarship to encourage good personal character and vocational careers among Career and Technical Education students. The nominee must be a MCPS senor, completing the final year of CTE studies. The nominee must also be planning to attend a community college or technical school next fall to complete an Associate Degree (or similar degree) in a career and technical field.

This year we have selected one applicant:

**Margaret Ferguson** is a senior in the Agriculture program at Blacksburg High School. She was an officer of FFA and studied Welding all four years in high school with emphasis on renewable energy. Her goal is to attend New River Community College to study welding to focus on wind turbines and produce more renewable energy and benefit the environment.

This year we have selected three scholarship recipients for the **Outstanding Math/Science Award**. The award is also given to a MCPS senior with outstanding credentials and the goal of further pursuit of a Math or Science education. Proper ethics, character, service to other, and past math/Science achievements weigh heavily in the selection process.

**Neha Nauman** is a senior at Blacksburg High School with a science focus on medicine. Neha has 4.16 GPA and was co-founder and president of the Biologist Club. She plans on majoring in Human Food and nutrition with a double major in Public Education to be a science teacher.

**Jordan Lockhart** is a senior at Auburn High School who served as the captain of the Science MACC (Mountain Area Academic Competition). She is both a Beta and National honor society member. She plans to continue in college in the field of Biology and medical sciences and a post graduate education to become a Physicians Assistant or Pharmacist.

**Jackson Schulz** is a senior from Christiansburg High School who won the Outstanding Math student award. Jackson earned 35 college credits in high school and is a member of the National Honor Society and Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society at NRCC. He was accepted into the VT Computational Modeling and Data Analytics program and also the Applied Mathematics program at Virginia Commonwealth University.


