PLEASE ALLOW A FEW MILKWEED PLANTS TO GROW IN YOUR YARD!

- From the Environmental Committee -



Why? Think of the lovely monarch butterfly. Its loveliness and fascinating migration pattern is not saving it. Its population had dropped greatly. HOWEVER, Blacksburg is helping out by proclaiming

itself a Monarch City. One thing each of us is encouraged to do is allow a few milkweed plants to grow in our yards.

Milkweed flowers attract pollinators including monarch butterflies. IN FACT, the monarch lays her eggs ONLY on milkweed leaves. And, when the distinctive monarch caterpillars emerge their only food is milkweed leaves. So, don't pull up the milkweed in the Spring and (before pulling it up in the fall) make sure all signs of the caterpillars are gone.

About This Week's Speaker

Fellow Rotarian Larry Hincker will speak this week about progress with the New River Valley Passenger Rail Initiative.

Passenger rail developments this year included an announcement by Gov. Northam in early May that Virginia reached agreement with Norfolk Southern Railway to extend passenger rail to the NRV and increase intercity service from Roanoke to the Northeast Corridor.

Larry retired in 2015 after spending 28 years in Virginia Tech communications, including 27 as chief communications officer under four Virginia Tech presidents.

In his Rotary Bulletin biography last year, Larry wrote: "Most of you know me as Tech's spokesperson. However, the job portfolio was comparable to a vice president for corporate communications – marketing, advertising, media relations, publications, licensing and trademark administration, the public radio station....and a whole bunch of 'issues management.'" As well, he was the public face of Virginia Tech when it dealt with the campus shootings in April 2007.

Before coming to Tech, Larry worked 14 years in various corporate communications positions including Westinghouse, Rockwell International, and Washington (state) Public Power Supply System.

He initially studied architecture at VT, holds a BA degree from Brooks Institute and an MBA from Virginia Tech.

He is married to Susan, who has done great volunteer service for our club in organizing massive amounts of club history documents and creating spreadsheets and other tools to make our club history more accessible. In gratitude and recognition, our club awarded Susan a Paul Harris Fellow about a year ago. Larry and Susan have three children and two grandchildren.

Passenger rail is but one of Larry's interests in retirement. Others include serving as board director on The Blacksburg Partnership, which he helped found; board service for Carilion NRV Medical Center (including chairmanship); serving as occasional guest columnist for The Roanoke Times; and, in his words, "spending copious time making sawdust" in his workshop.
