Meet District Governor Tara Ellis



Tara Ellis joined the Rotary Club of Bristol VA-TN in 2010 and immediately became a very active member. She served as the 99th President in 2015-2016 as well as a member of the Board of Directors. In 2017, Tara led our District's GSE team to India. She led the Rotary Club of Bristol VA-TN in raising more than \$12,000 and served as the International Partner toward the

Global Grant initiated by Rotary District 3060 in India that purchased, installed, and trained staff on twenty dialysis machines that were placed at existing facilities in order to provide much needed access to dialysis at a very reasonable cost for the poorest in Gujarat-Maharastra India.

Tara is a Major Donor, a Sustaining Member, a member of the Paul Harris Society and Bequest Society, a Benefactor, and a Skelton Fellow. She is an RLI graduate, was a member of the 2018 Zone 33/34 Emerging Leaders Class and received the District Service Award for 2017-2018.

In her professional life, Tara is the Director of Management Services at Bristol Tennessee Essential Services (BTES) where she is responsible for human resources, the customer service department, and BTES' facilities. She holds a bachelor's degree in English and Communications, an MBA with a concentration in Marketing, a Professional Human Resource (PHR) certification, and is a Society of Human Resource Management – Certified Professional (SHRM-CP). Tara and her husband, Paul, live in Northeast Tennessee.

Meet Rotary's New President

Shekhar Mehta, a member of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, has been a Rotarian since 1985. He trained as an accountant and founded a real estate development company, Skyline Group, which he also chairs. But his professional title tells only a small part of the story of who he is. He is also a director of the India arm of Operation Eyesight Universal, a Canadabased nonprofit focused on preventing avoidable blindness. He helped establish



more than 15 eye hospitals, in several Indian states, that together carry out nearly 50,000 surgeries each year. And he started Saving Little Hearts, a project that has facilitated more than 2,500 heart surgeries for children from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, and some African countries and that is now an India-wide program.

At the International Assembly this year, Shekhar talked about how he and some fellow Rotarians decided to start a local version of ShelterBox, a Rotarian-founded organization based in the UK. "We named it Shelter Kit and put 52 items of daily need in a large trunk," he told the incoming district governors. "Over the last 15 years, in every major disaster in India, Indian Rotarians have volunteered to bring Shelter Kits to areas struck by disasters." The program already has served about 75,000 people. Shekhar also served on the ShelterBox board of trustees.

And he is also the architect of the TEACH program, which aims to do nothing less than end illiteracy in India. (You'll read more about this ambitious program in a future issue.)

Although Shekhar is skilled in the business arts, he prefers to engage his other fluencies. He told me that, after so much studying and reading during his career, he now favors learning by talking to people. He added, "I hate accounting." It all follows his belief that we would do well to think from our hearts as much as our minds.
