Some GOOD Environmental Health News

From your Environmental Committee

Many of you have probably heard of "forever chemicals'? These PFAS (forever) chemicals are hard-to-destroy and increa singly contaminate water and soil. They have been shown – at exposure above certain levels – to be toxic in a number of ways. And, because they are so persistent, they accumulate in the environment to increasingly worrisome levels. PFAS chemicals contaminate water and soil at thousands of sites in the US.

PFAS chemicals are very useful and are found, e.g., in fire-fighting foams and the nonstick coating, Teflon. PFAS chemicals, those considered the most toxic, have been banned. The substitutes now used are apparently safer, but remain a concern.

However, a surprisingly simple method has been found to destroy one major category of PFAS. You may have heard of the common industrial solvent that has been used for many years – dimethylsulfoxide (DMSO). DMSO also has medicinal uses.

Now it has been discovered that DMSO, combined with common alkali and heated to boiling, destroys a large subset of PFAS compounds. There is hope that a related method may be found to destroy a second common PFAS group. If you are interested see short straightforward article describing what has happened at this link.


