This Week's Program



Less than 29 members: Three (3) Electives per Category 30-69 members: Four (4) Electives per Category 70-99 members: Five (5) Electives per Category 100 + members: Six (6) Electives

Gold Club achievement is measured from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

Activities with a due date that is different than the end of the Rotary year are highlighted in GOLD.

By completing the items with the light blue background, your club will qualify for the Rotary Citation.

Note 1: President-Elect attendance at District 7570 PETS is required of all incoming Club Presidents, regardless of how many times they have served in that capacity. If the President-Elect cannot attend PETS due to a schedule conflict, he or she should arrange to attend a neighboring District PETS. Plans should be secured well in advance, since the D7570 PETS is held relatively late in the training season. If the President-Elect cannot attend PETS because of sudden illness or emergency and informs the DGE in advance of the D7570 PETS, then the District will arrange an opportunity for a make up PETS sessions and will excuse attendance at District Legislative Assembly (DLA). If unable to attend DLA, a Proxy form should be completed prior to DLA with permission from the DGE.

Note 2: Club Information is accessed via DACdb -- My Club -- Club or Member Edit. Items required to satisfy requirement: (1) Current Club meeting place, day, time, location, and directions; (2) Member Foundation status: SM Sustaining Member, PHF Paul Harris Fellow, and PHS Paul Harris Society; (3) at least one phone number for each member; (4) current email, if applicable; (5) Member birthdate - month, day, & year (for Club & RI statistics only; member privacy will be maintained and DOB will not be published); (6) Photos are requested, but not required for privacy issues.

Note 3: Please note that criteria for the "2021-2022 Rotary Citation for Rotary Clubs" have been incorporated into the criteria of Gold Club.
